### DOWNTON CUCKOO FAIR 2023

The Cuckoo Fair will return to Downton on Saturday 29 April with 250 stalls offering a mix of creative, crafty and delicious items. There will

be new bands and entertainers joining the celebration this year, as well as some familiar faces.

This year there are 55 new stalls and a drop-in Toddler Quiet Zone at the Downton Community Pre-School, accessed via the Memorial Gardens.

The traditional crowning of the Cuckoo Fair Princess outside The Goat at 10am and the parade to the Maypole signals the start of the festivities to celebrate Spring and hopefully the return of the cuckoos to Downton and the surrounding countryside.

The Co-op car park will be closed on the Friday evening before the Fair in preparation for the set-up of the

Produce Market. Vehicles should therefore be removed from the car park before 6pm on Friday 28 April. The charge for the car parks has risen to £7 per car – this was last changed over 8 years ago.

It is estimated that since 1980 the Fair has helped raise in excess of £1 million for local organisations. The Fair is run entirely by a team of volunteers and relies on the income generated to cover the costs. Any money raised over and above running costs

is offered back into the local community, including covering the costs of a Christmas tree which is gifted to the village - and running the Fair the following year.



A new shop has recently opened in the High Street, taking over the burnt out premises of the old grocery store. It's run by Mat and Alice Trim, who are offering a range of services, as well as the opportunity to buy / order items that have been repaired / recycled.

Mat moved to Downton from Ferndown when he bought his first house here eight years ago and Alice moved shortly after from Nomansland.

Alice says: "We both absolutely love Downton and the friendly nature of its residents. With the beautiful surrounding farmland and rivers there is no place we would rather be!" The Trims' first baby is due at the end of April - opening the shop has given them the opportunity to work together, sharing responsibilities and having flexibility to deal with baby related day to day activities.

The business focuses on good quality items and repairing rather then replacing, which is better for both the environment and in the long term is more cost effective: pieces of furniture that will stay in homes forever, re-soling quality shoes that can last a lifetime as well as sharpening knives, garden tools, scissors and axes instead of buying new ones.

They sell a selection of handmade and unique items from coffee tables to mirrors along with a

variety of second hand goodyear welted leather shoes that have been repaired or rebuilt. Within the village their focus is on the following services:

- knife sharpening
- · scissor sharpening
- chisel, axe, and garden tool sharpening
- bespoke carpentry
- · leather repairs
- shoe repairs & restoration

Their most interesting requests since opening has been to sharpen some ice skates!

Due to the variety of services, every day is very different.

Generally carpentry and shoe repairs take up the majority of time and every day ends with sharpening.

Alice and Mat would like to be able to offer more to the village further down the line including some fun, light hearted educational sessions so people can see how things are made and what materials go into them. Alice says: "A lot of the services we offer have died out but with a greener future becoming the public's main focus we believe there will be less of the 'throw away society' and people will start to invest in things that will last."

### LOVER REPAIR CAFE

The Repair Cafe have been going for some time now - and some interesting statistics have been produced, with help from Farnham Repair Cafe and the University for Creative Arts, Farnham. From the cafe's 453 sessions, 3,606 jobs have been completed satisfactorily - which equates to an 88% success rate. Approximately 13.5 tonnes of landfill has been diverted and CO2 emissions have been reduced by 105 tonnes. This all amounts to a potential saving of £250,000 by the community. All involved are extremely pleased to know what a difference

they are making to the environment, in addition to the substantial donations to charity. Recently they have been able to send £1,000 to UK DEC in aid of the Turkey & Syrian Earthquake Appeal.



### PROFILE: DOWNTON'S NEW TENNIS COACH, LEE MAHONY

InDownton recently caught up with the new Tennis Coach at the Leisure Centre:

### What got you into tennis?

I started playing tennis at 13 after a group lesson in Dorchester with a friend. I woke up the next morning and instantly knew that tennis was what I wanted to do.

### How long have you been a tennis coach?

I have been coaching for 25 years. After being a tennis professional player, achieving an ITF junior ranking of 496, and enjoying a successful playing career, I moved into coaching aged 23.

### Why did you choose to work at Downton Leisure Centre?

I knew the centre and the people well and felt that it would be a great to build up the tennis centre and give the people in the area a coaching team they could be proud of. Also, having indoor courts over the winter is a bonus! I have always had a connection with Downton through clients, coaches and players. I live in Nunton and two of my children go to Burgate school.

### Why is tennis good for you?

This is a very open question but in short, tennis teaches you so much about yourself, it is great for developing coordination skills, and brilliant for cardio. Tennis also connects you to so many people and is a very social sport; it is incredible how many people play tennis in the area.

### Who can play tennis at Downton?

Anyone can play tennis at Downton from age 3 to 103 as a member or non-member.

### What is on offer at the leisure centre for those interested in tennis?

The Leisure Centre has two indoor courts, three outdoor courts, mini tennis courts and a practice wall. We offer individual and group coaching for adults and juniors.

For beginner and intermediate adults, you can join a Tennis Xpress 6-week course to learn and develop your basic shots or drop into a Cardio Tennis session, which is a fun, sociable group fitness class with a tennis twist, open to anyone of all ages and abilities.

There are some advanced adult coaching sessions and workshops too, for more competitive players as well as Club sessions offering more social tennis. For juniors (age 4-18 years) we run coaching for all standards as well as more performance-focused coaching for players who are looking to play competitively. We have county, regional and national players in our programme. We have term-time tennis throughout the week as well as school holiday tennis camps such as our Easter Camp in April.

We hope there is something for everyone at Downton now in terms of tennis - whether you are looking to get fit, are a complete beginner, or a highly competitive player. ### DOWNTON BOWLING CLUB - A GREEN OF THEIR OWN

The Bowling Club is celebrating 40 years at its current Wick Lane site. At the recent AGM, a founder member, Bob Dymott, spoke about the club's history.

Prior to 1983, people played bowls on part of the primary school playing field. They would meet and set up the boundaries to a 'green' using lengths of guttering and bits of string. Although many participants were not knowledgeable about the sport, one was: established bowls player and administrator Ralph Bentley. Ralph had been a previous President of The English Bowling Association and he became Captain of the Club in 1980 for three seasons. Mr Lunt of the Downton Tannery was the President.

Club members did occasionally play on the club green at Alderbury, and under Ralph's captaincy in 1982/3 an opportunity arose to build a green at what was to become the Brian Whitehead Sports and Social Club in Wick



Lane. The football club was establishing the upper part of the land. Many Bowling Club members helped to erect the original facilities.

When a building was needed, Bob Dymott and Les Cousins moved a redundant village hall from the Broad Chalke area piece by piece. This construction is what you see as the bar area in the Social Club today. Others helped with the roofing, including Jim and Dave Galpin. Vic Bryant, Don and Ron Moody were involved as was Ralph's son-in-law, Mike Hallam. Ralph organised contractors to produce a bowling Green to the required standard. Stubby Sherwood also devoted a lot of time and resources to this project.

Downton Bowling Club will never forget Ralph Bentley as his portrait hangs in the Clubhouse and an annual competition is played in his honour. He and many others worked hard to establish Club, but unfortunately, he died without actually playing on the new Green.



Bob Dymott took over as Club Captain and Vic Bryant was the first Greenkeeper.

### UKRAINIAN FUND RAISING EVENING TOPS £3,000

A fund raising event to buy special bandages to send to military hospitals in Ukraine, has raised over £3000. The Ukrainian evening was the idea of Svitlana Kondzelia, who has been living in the village for the past 9 months, and Effie Grand, Consultant Haematologist at Salisbury Hospital.

Svitlana and her husband, both lawyers, were living in Bucha, in the Kiev Region of Ukraine. During the first weeks of the invasion, Bucha was

occupied by Russian troops. Last April, Svitlana managed to escape with her 8 year old son and they are now living in Downton. In her words 'We managed to leave this territory literally by a miracle. At home, we left not only our home and such a familiar and happy way of life, but also our loved ones my husband (Ivan's dad), my father (who has been in the UK since December last year), my sister and her family. My husband now works as a volunteer, cooperating with charitable foundations, traveling to eastern Ukraine to the front line with





humanitarian assistance. It became clear that there is an urgent need for hemostatic drugs, which are very expensive. Svitlana and Effie have managed to source CELOX bandages for half the cost of those on the Ukrainian Market, from UK manufacturer CELOX.

The Baptist Church was absolutely full for the evening. Svitlana and the team made Ukrainian borscht and dumplings, and provided drinks and desserts. There was also entertainment - Ukrainian music and songs, performed by Svitlana and her father.






### THE SKY AT NIGHT BY MICHAEL BARRATT



When InDownton visited, Ernie was having fun with bubbles, and playing with Phonic Fox.






### BIG BAND GIG RAISES £1,000 FOR CHARITY
