represents the percentage of parents who said their child was happy at their school. Trafalgar School at Downton came out on top for Wiltshire with 97% of parents saying they felt their child was happy at school.

School pupils have recently been successful in a number of areas. Billy Dixon-Clarke won the Year 7 - 10 category in the Rotary Ringwood Interschool photographic competition and went on to win the overall Young Photographer of the Year. In Technology, the school competed in the Faraday Challenge held at Bournemouth University, an annual competition that introduces students to engineering, inspiring them to consider engineering as a career. 17 Key Stage 3 students travelled to the Lights theatre in Andover to perform as part of the Shakespeare Festival in Schools. A team from the school were Panatholon County Final Winners, an annual competition which provides an opportunity for young people with disabilities and special educational needs to take part in competitive sport.

CUCKOO FAIR RETURNS

The Cuckoo Fair is back this year on Saturday 3 May, from 10am - 4:30pm. New volunteers have strengthened the team and everyone is excited to be back for 2025. The Borough will be closed to traffic, except emergency vehicles, from The Bull Hotel to The Tannery from 8.30am - 6pm on the day. Local residents will receive an information letter two weeks beforehand, with relevant details. Traffic cones will not be set out by the Cuckoo Fair Team this year due to damage and significant loss in previous years. To ensure the safety of all visitors, stall holders, and the general public, barriers will be in use at vehicular entry points to the fair. These will be manned, and are moveable in case of emergency.

The fair will be largely the same as before, with plenty of familiar and new stallholders, entertainment and activities for all the family. Food and drink will be offered at various outlets throughout the fair. Many children from Downton Primary School submitted a design for the Cuckoo Fair Day information leaflet resulting in a difficult decision for the team. The leaflets will be handed out at the car parks and be available at the information stall.

Parking will be available at Trafalgar School and off the A338 and there will be a park and ride service from the Barford lane car park.

TEAM FROM DOWNTON VISIT PHILIPPINES

A team from Downton Baptist Church spent two weeks with communities that live in slum areas in the Philippines. The visit was part of a longstanding relationship between the Purple Community Fund (PCF) and DBC which goes back many years. PCF aims to provide sustainable opportunities to help poverty stricken families and communities transform their own lives through skills training, education, health and nutrition programmes.

The team members from DBC had experience in mental and physical health, education and pastoral support. They helped with craft work for seniors and sessions for children and learned more about what support can be most helpful to support families out of poverty in the face of the many challenges including floods, earthquakes and fires.

The team were keen to provide practical help and learn from those that live daily with the challenge of trying to stay healthy and provide better futures for children and you people.

There will be an opportunity to find out more about the trip and how to help the charity in its work with communities. Liz Tanner can be found at local craft and eco/sustainable events selling a selection of hand spun yarn, blended fibres, yarn craft kits and free-woven textiles. Liz says, "I love yarn, but I hate waste, so I blend locally sourced animal fibres with sustainable textile waste to spin squishy nature-inspired art yarns." She uses her yarns for Saori-style weaving on a rigid heddle loom, and for knitting and crochet; any fibres she doesn't spin are woven on a peg loom or felted to produce natural, earthy rugs and cushions.

Liz is also passionate about informing and inspiring others, so she creates spinning and weaving kits, and runs workshops and classes, where she promotes a mindful and sustainable way of life, "keeping traditional crafts alive in an ever-changing world". She runs a weekly 'Knit & natter / Crochet & chat' session at the Goat and a monthly session at Stable & Wick - details and on-line booking available from her website: atailofyarn.com.

PARISH COUNCIL BULB PLANTING

The bulbs that were so generously donated by the community are peeping through the grass on the entrance to the cemetery, in the new reflection zone and on the Beacon green. The council has been working with volunteers and Eco Council pupils at Downton Primary School to plant hedging saplings amongst some of the gaps in the cemetery hedge. At least 6 bags of rubbish were removed. The council requests that people do not trespass on the adjacent Longford Estate field and then use the cemetery as a cut through, otherwise all the hard work of planting the saplings will be spoiled.

Look out for the two new Parish litter pickers who will start in the next couple of weeks, concentrating on Moot Lane, Moot Recreation field, Barford Lane, High Street, Memorial Gardens, The Borough and anywhere else that needs them. Litter is still a problem despite the bins situated everywhere.



VILLAGE IMPROVEMENTS

Reconditioning work to the railings outside the Memorial Gardens is imminent, so when the signs are up, please be aware that there might be a bit of disruption, and don't get too close to the wet paint. Repairs are complete to the concrete pathway by the public toilets and to the shelter floor in the Memorial Gardens. Work has been carried out to replace the missing posts on the Borough Greens (this should stop any further churning up of the grass).





SKY AT NIGHT BY MICHAEL F. BARRATT FRAS

April's full moon is known as a "Pink Moon" - named after the herb moss pink, or wild ground phlox.

There is a possibility that there will be another display of the Northern Lights during April. The timing is unpredictable but there are a number of good apps that provide aurora alerts, including Aurora WatchUK. Look northwards for a misty white sky with the odd greenish glow - the human eye does not always see the vivid colours which come out in photos.

The Lyrid meteor-shower is active during the 3rd week of April, probably peaking on the night of 22/ 23 April. This coincides with a waning crescent Moon and will be best observed before midnight. The meteors seem to radiate outwards from a point in the

constellation of Lyra (the Lyre), close to the bright blue star Vega, which is high in the south-east. This shower is made up of debris left from comet Thatcher and often leaves glowing trails of dust.

He has now retired to Bournemouth.

DBC COMMUNITY GARDEN

Already the team has planted leeks, the first row of potatoes and the first carrots. “We’re trialling a new experiment this year,” says Gwen, one of the more experienced gardeners. “I’m going to start the carrots off in sand because apparently you get better germination.” Carrots are notoriously hard to get going, so watch this space to see whether the experiment works.

The garden grows a mix of fresh produce over the summer and autumn. This is given away to the local Downton community through the Larder foodbank which is held in the church building on Monday evenings and Wednesday mornings.

Team member, David, is planning to give away dahlia plants this year. They are already sprouting and he will be taking cuttings over the next few weeks, which should be rooted by the end of March. They will be pinched out and potted on, ready to go in the ground by the end of May.

The back of the garden and edges of the field have recently been cleared and team member, Richard, has recycled western red cedar timbers to build benches, replacing the old plastic chairs, and so creating a welcoming area where people can come and sit.

Under the trees at the far end of the garden, Gwen has been planting snowdrops which have been lifted from another garden and divided. Planting them like this, ‘in the green’, is a much more successful way of propagating the supply than planting dry tubers in the autumn. Just dig up a well-established clump, split into three or four bunches (about the size of a bunch of spring onions you might get in a supermarket) and replant to create a snowdrop colony.

Next door to the raised bed area is the prayer garden which has been completely rejuvenated over the last two years by Jenny, a Downton local. It’s looking gorgeous, with shoots appearing and new life everywhere. “When I first came, the focus was on building the raised beds,” says Jenny. “I thought I could do up the prayer garden as I had a good supply of plants from my own garden.” The area has been transformed into a lovely reflective space with comfortable seating for anyone who wishes to come and spend time there.

The team meets in the community garden at the back of Downton Baptist church on a Sunday and Thursday afternoon. All are welcome to help gardening, or just to sit and chat. Do come along. There may even be cake!
