## Tony Pike, Cuckoo Fair Founder and Chairman

Long time Chairman of the Cuckoo Fair, Tony Pike, died at his home on 11 January. He was one of the villagers who planned its regeneration in 1980. With his wife, Edna, Tony oversaw the fair as it developed from a fair centred on the Moot, to the largest free community event in the county attracting around 20,000 visitors a year.

The fair has raised over £1 million for local groups. Despite the complexity of running such a large event, Tony steered the organisation through many challenges including the aftermath of the covid pandemic and the new legal requirements to ensure the safety of so many visitors.

As well as his work with the Cuckoo Fair, Tony supported and helped lead other village groups including being Chairman of the scouts, when he led the efforts to get the scout hut built. His funeral service is at 2.30pm on Wednesday 4 February at St Laurence Church, and afterwards at the Sherwood Rooms in Wick Lane. All are welcome. Donations in his memory can be made to St Laurence Church.

## DOWNTON FOOTBALL CLUB FA VASE SUCCESS

Downton Football Club have an important game coming up on 7 February. The club has reached the last 16 of the Isuzu FA Vase competition, the furthest that they have ever reached. They beat Slimbridge AFC on penalties (4-3) after the match finished without score on 17 January. The competition is for teams playing in specified lower levels of the English National League, and this year over 600 teams entered. Downton's fifth round match is at home against Essex League club, Lymore Gardens. ## A WINTER WALK FROM DOWNTON: JUST OVER 3 MILES

Start at the Avon Valley path fingerpost near the Moot recreation ground in Moot Lane. Location: //W3W wound.galaxy.stirs

Follow the footpath up the hill, keep a look out for the newly planted electric fence whilst the cattle munch on mangle wurzels!



Walk to the top, and turn right along the hedge, walking towards a gate. Cross over the lane and over a stile and walk down the hill, looking at the beautiful pines on your left. Its very boggy at the bottom!

Go over the stile and up a steep little hill and go over the stile, turning right to walk along a sandy path. You will soon come to Lodge Farm. Carry on down the track, looking at the beautiful folds of farmland and little pockets of trees. In the summer, adders frequent the woodland to the side of the track, but remain hidden and cosy in the winter months.

At the end of the track you will come to Moot Lane - turn right and walk along the road.

When you get to the road bridge by the sewage works, turn left down that track. To the left of the sewage works is the old railway line and Pile Bridge, through woodland. This will bring you out into Millennium Green, walk along the Avon with the willows, swans and the occasional flash of a Kingfisher.

Carry on toward the Moot along the Avon, and go through the Moot gate. Follow the paths around the Moot looking at the Snowdrops and then exit.

## PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Could you help make 2026 the year of volunteering? The Parish always needs handy people to help keep it looking its best including footpath maintenance and lots of other jobs like sanding down and repairing our benches. Why not join the Downton Parish Council (DPC)? Help influence and make decisions for the parish.

Steve, the Parish Steward's next visit will be 11-12 February. Email Susan Parsons if you spot any jobs which are needed. DPC and Wiltshire Council are making sure the Parish is winter ready and resilient – contact DPC if you see any blocked gullies.

Traffic survey equipment is still being placed around Downton, 11 locations in total, forming evidence-based data on vehicle numbers, size and speed.

One of the gates to the Memorial Gardens is now completely off its hinges plus another one also needs attention – DPC is obtaining a quote for the work.

If you experience anti-social behaviour or any crime or disturbance, the DPC has emphasised how important it is to report it to the local Police. The Police do not respond to crimes reported on Facebook. In an emergency always dial 999 if: there is an immediate danger to life, someone is using violence or is threatening to be violent, a crime is happening right now, like a house burglary or a theft, the suspect is still at the scene. If the problem is a non-emergency, dial 101: for example, if you are experiencing anti-social behaviour, door knocking etc.

The local PC is Marc Evans, and our local police can be reached through dialling 101, or his mobile 07876 817927 which is active when PC Evans is on duty.

The Parish Council meetings are held on the second Monday of the month in the Bonvalot Room in the Downton Memorial Centre. Meetings start at 7pm. There is always a public question time at the beginning of the meeting, so do come along and have your say. It is our Parish after all!

## TELEPHONE BOX PURCHASED FOR THE VILLAGE

The Parish Council has purchased the disused telephone box next to the library. Its an example of one of the iconic model K6 kiosks designed by Sir Giles Gilbert Scott to commemorate the coronation of King George V in 1935. Over 60,000 were installed around the country and around 11,000 remain. DPC are deciding on its future use shortly.

## DOWNTON DOWNTIME

Downton Downtime is a weekly gathering for people living with dementia, their carers, older adults, and others seeking social and creative activities. It takes place during term time every Tuesday from 10:15am to 12pm at Downton Baptist Church, South Lane.

The sessions provide opportunities to meet others, share experiences, and take part in a range of activities. These include music, gentle movement, crafts, games, puzzles, and creative activities, which are intended to support wellbeing and engagement.

Carers are welcome to attend and participate or spend time with others in similar situations. Doors open at 10am with refreshments available. Each session begins with time for conversation before moving on to planned activities. ## SKY AT NIGHT BY MICHAEL F. BARRATT FRAS

Now is a good time to be viewing the winter constellations, with Orion (the Hunter) dominating the south-eastern skyline. Also visible are Auriga (the Charioteer), Gemini (the Twins) and Canis Major (the Great Dog). Within these constellations are many open star clusters which can be spotted using binoculars including Messier 44 (the Beehive), which will be found in the constellation of Cancer (the Crab) and is a large bright open cluster about halfway between the constellations of Gemini and Leo.

A bit further away (around 12 million light years!) and more of a challenge, in Ursa Major (the Great Bear) will be found two galaxies which are just visible through good binoculars – Messier 81 (the Cigar Galaxy) and Messier 82 (Bode’s Galaxy).

Saturn is the only planet now clearly visible in the western sky and from 8 February will act as a good guide to finding Mercury, which will be just below it. Mercury is putting on its best evening performance of the year but gradually fading. There is only a short window of opportunity to see it as by 19 February, it will be setting at around 7 pm. If you do see it, you will have done something which the famous Polish astronomer Nicolaus Copernicus never managed to do.

Venus will have appeared by the middle of the month and on the evenings of 18 & 19 February, the crescent Moon will “play tag” with Venus, Mercury and Saturn - a great photo opportunity to “bag” four solar system objects together with a smart phone camera. Jupiter continues its all night “residency” in the constellation of Gemini (the Twins) and is easily found close to the first magnitude stars Castor and Pollux setting around 7.45 pm. If you have binoculars, Uranus (with its greenish tinge) will be found in the constellation of Taurus (the Bull) setting at around 1.30pm

Neptune and Saturn are both in the constellation of Pisces, setting at around 8pm. This month they will appear very close together, and Neptune (the outermost planet) will be clearly identified by its greenish glow.

The full moon on February 17 is called the “Snow” Moon.

On Saturday 24 January, Mark and his team took to the roads and tracks running from Brockenhurst Football Club to Downton Football Club, a total of 19.5 miles in just under 4 hours. Mark was joined by Laura McGregor, Robbie Loader, Karolina Korys-Jones and Owen Haviland. For the final push they were joined by reserve team players Luke Charity and Tom Williams and youth team players Zoe McGregor, Sophie McGregor and William Loader. So far £4,393 has been raised from the run, well over original £1,000 target.

The overall total raised by the club is now over £10,000. Those who wish to donate can do so on the Just Giving website (search for "Mark Gulliver"). The next Charity event is a match between Downton Vets and Fordingbridge Vets on Sunday 22 February, kick off 11am.

## CUCKOO FAIR: FURTHER THINGS YOU MAY NOT KNOW

1). It takes 22 volunteers over six months to plan for and run the annual Cuckoo Fair. This is not including volunteers who help around Event time. This is to provide just six official hours of a safe and enjoyable Cuckoo Fair.

2). Planning for the Cuckoo Fair runs from early October right up to Fair day, This year, its on 2 May.

3). Every year it has to satisfy requirements from the Wiltshire Council's Event Safety Advisory Group, Government GDPR regulations, Event Insurance policies, the Parish Council, Safeguarding regulations, DBS checking, Event Industry Forum (Purple Guide), Health & Safety Executive, Wiltshire Police and UK Counter Terrorism, by updating the plans to also include Medical Cover, Security cover, our Event Management Plan, Welfare Centre arrangements, Training Roles and Responsibilities, Terms and Conditions and our Risk Analysis.

4). 88 individual issues/ improvements were raised post Cuckoo Fair 2025 which have been used to improve the Fair.

5). A new "Village Liaison Team" has been recruited to deal with queries from local residents, clubs, schools, charities and local businesses. They will also deliver important information regarding the Fair.

6). There will be open stakeholder meetings in the village before Cuckoo Fair 2026 where residents and interested parties can come along, contribute and ask any questions. The next one is on 18 February at 7pm at Downton Baptist Church.

7). Last year, Toomers Ltd designed, built and positioned new Hostile Vehicle Mitigation barriers free of charge. This year they will provide the barriers again and sponsor the Fair. Batt Broadbent Solicitors have contributed to the printing of the Day Leaflet.

8). In 2024 10 new Core Team members were recruited with defined roles and responsibilities to enable the 2025 Fair to run.

9). The Cuckoo Fair is run on a Not for Profit basis. The aim is simply to cover costs.

10). This year there are Cuckoo Fair Business Cards for possible future Stallholders and Entertainers to help provide a supply of new attractions.
